FROM THE DIRECTOR

The human spirit is hard to break. Whether we are faced with loss and devastation from a hurricane, earthquake, tornado, or other natural disaster there are times when the resolve of the human spirit is tested to its limits and the foundations on which our communities are built seem to crumble, leaving us vulnerable and exposed.

By The Water is about two Staten Island families, the Murphy's and the Carter's, who have the very limits of their human spirit tested while living in the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy. Their community has been obliterated and literally rocked to its core. In the days that follow the hurricane these families are left to pick up the pieces of their lives and figure out how they are going to move forward.

The Murphy family has been tested by personal relationships and resentment long before Hurricane Sandy tears apart their physical home. After the hurricane strikes their inner feelings and past secrets test them in ways they would never have expected. At a time rife with desperation, loss and devastation following the storm we see further schisms in the relationships between father and son, brother and brother, and husband and wife.

In addition to the conflict within the family there is another layer of conflict within the community that has suffered the loss of lives of people they know. The decision to stay and rebuild or take a government buyout and relocate pits lifelong friends and neighbors against each other. Marty Murphy has deep seated personal reasons for desperately wanting to rebuild his lifelong community but so many of his neighbors are tired of fighting Mother Nature and are ready to move away. This has very real and severe implications on those long-standing friendships and we see the various fears of each of these characters fully embodied.

Sharyn Rothstein has said in interviews that she is interested in writing plays that address issues of social responsibility, show honest relationships with real people, and have a lot of heart. Each of the characters in **By The Water** could be someone we know. Their honesty, heart, and extremely resilient human nature make these characters accessible to us and we feel for them as they try to forge their uncertain futures in the aftermath of Hurricane Sandy.

Thank you to Ray for giving me the chance to bring this compelling, relevant, and engaging story to the stage for SCTC's current season celebrating female playwrights. Thank you to Ashley and Bob for being there behind the scenes with invaluable support. Also thanks to each and every one of the incredibly talented and hard working cast and crew for taking this rewarding and insightful journey with me. I have immensely enjoyed working with each and every one of you. Your commitment and dedication to this work has made this process a complete joy.

My hope is that **By The Water** moves you in ways you might not expect. I also hope that you can connect to the strength of these characters and realize your human spirit can enable you to muster a steadfast determination along with the courage to stare down adversity in the face of despair.
